Dangote Distributes ₩16 **Billion Rice to Nigerians**

The Aliko Dangote Foundation has launched a **₹16** billion food aid program, distributing rice to one million Nigerians. The initiative, covering all 774 LGAs, aims to combat hunger and support vulnerable communities.

REPS APPROVE NEW VAT SHARING FORMULA

The House of Representatives has approved a new VAT sharing formula, allocating 55% to states and 35% to local governments. The revised tax bill also changes corporate tax filing, tax waivers, and the development levy distribution. Final approval is expected next week.

EL-RUFAI CLAIMS BUHARI SANCTIONED HIS DEFECTION

Nasir El-Rufai says he left APC with Buhari's blessing, accusing the party of abandoning its values. He also denied leaving because he was snubbed for a ministerial job.




OBASANJO WARNS TINUBU MAY BE WORSE THAN BUHARI
