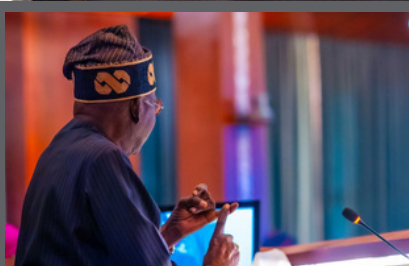
EFCC CONVICT 4,000, RECOVER \$500 MILLION IN 2024
